2012: Coastal Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (CORE MPO) discussed the entire project to replace the entire road from the Bull River Bridge to the Lazaretto Creek Bridge (US Highway 80). See link below.

2012-2016: Public Hearings and outreach (*Meeting Minutes*)

December 2016: Technical Advisory Council Concept meeting / Made decision to move the Bull River Bridge Replacement to the South and this decision was made solely on the Georgia Power Lines to the North / Those power lines have been moved, so the replacement of the bridge should go to the north, as originally planned

2017: Description of Current Plan for entire project

Lazaretto Creek Bridge - Per original plan remains to the North of the current Bridge

Highway 80 McQueen Island to Tybee Island - Per original Plan remains to the North

Bull River Bridge -Location moved to the South of the current Bridge

2018: The Power lines cited in the TAC Meeting of 2016 moved north and significantly raised on steel towers from their original location thus no longer presenting any issues for constructing the new bridge consistent with the 2012 DOT recommendation.
